- satisfactory plus (3.5): As above, although with noticeable shortcomings of the abovementioned areas subject to evaluation. The student has problems in the selection of sources and the efficiency

of information retrieval; (s)he speaks and writes English sufficiently to meet the requirements of the academic style, there are numerous errors affecting the clarity of the argument.

- satisfactory (3.0): The student has sufficiently mastered the required knowledge and acquired the required skills in the areas that are subject to assessment; (s)he has problems in the selection of sources; the student speaks English sufficiently to meet the requirements of the academic style, there are numerous errors affecting the clarity of the argument.

- unsatisfactory (2.0): The student is not familiar with the issues raised during the seminar; (s)he cannot work with sources.
