- satisfactory (3.0): The student has sufficiently mastered the required knowledge and acquired the required skills in the areas that are subject to assessment; (s)he makes numerous errors in the research process; the student speaks and writes English sufficiently to meet the requirements of the academic style, there are numerous errors affecting the clarity of the argument.

- unsatisfactory (2.0): The student is not familiar with the issues raised during the seminar; (s)he cannot formulate the research problem, work with sources, organise and conduct own research work.
